Every day counts!

I have included a graphic below that gives some statistics of the roll-on effects of habitually missing school, from just a few minutes to whole days. It highlights the effects over time giving a clear picture of the importance of consistent attendance at school. For student absences, please ensure that you call the office and give a reason for the absence on 41694333.

Bullying and teasing

On parade this week I spoke to the students about bullying and teasing. I discussed some strategies that should be used if somebody bullies or teases. These strategies could be used in sequence or choose the best strategy for the situation.

- 1. Say "Stop, I don't like what you're doing or saying."
- 2. If the bullying doesn't stop, walk away. Walk away and play or work with people who don't bully.
- 3. **Go** seek support and **report it to a teacher on duty**, your classroom teacher or the office. If we don't know about an incident, we can't do anything about it.

Arrival time at school

The earliest your child should be arriving at school is the first bell at 8.30am. Students who arrive earlier than this are unsupervised as there are no staff on duty until then.

If, and only if there is an exceptional circumstance for arriving early, please make sure that the office admin has been advised and your child will be able to wait safely at the office until 8.30am.


ITD Elective

Students have been working on small engines during term two in the unit titled Small Engines. They have studied the theory of two and four stroke engines, looking at the advantages and disadvantages of their performance and applications.




Gymnastics
