Under this agreement for 2022 Proston State School P-10 will receive





- increase the percentage of students achieving NAPLAN national minimum standard (NMS) to 90% in reading in 2022
- ensure **100% of teachers are implementing uninterrupted literacy blocks** that focus on "The Simple View of Reading" framework across the school
- Implement the Accelerated Reading program for primary students who are at risk of not reaching benchmark. Target in 2022 for 70% of students to achieve at or above reading benchmark across all year levels
- Improve the percentage of students gaining Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) points through offering TAFE courses and other senior schooling pathway programs to 100%

Our initiatives include

- ensuring whole school reading practices are embedded in weekly timetabling of all P-10 teachers
- secondary students participating in balanced instructional reading routines" Modelled , Shared, Guided and Independent
- the whole school vocabulary focus in 2022 is tier two words using "STRIVE"
- subject specific vocabulary being explicitly taught across the whole school
- supporting our Kindy & Prep Early Phase Learning classrooms through additional support and resourcing to assist in the delivery of improved Oral Language Learning and Early Literacy Development
- building teacher capability in embedding literacy capabilities across all learning areas and all year levels
- ongoing support for Proston State School P-10 Accelerated Reading Program
- implementing Speech Language programs; OLEY (Oral Language for Early Years Program), POLY language program, Proston PM sight words program (derived from the PM reading scheme) and screeners
- the continued implementation of whole school observation and feedback processes to focus on agreed Proston literacy and pedagogical practice
- continuing to implement Proston's State School P-10 Positive Behaviour Program to support a culture of high expectations for student behaviour and achievement
- providing more effective transitioning of year 10's into senior schooling through engagement with the TAFE and other pathways
- leasing a 12 seater Commuter Bus for 24 months to assist in providing reliable and sustainable transport for TAFE students, Cattle Show Team and local excusions aligned to curriculum
